Getting to Know your Local Registered Forester Part #2

f you read my article in the January newsletter entitled "Getting to know local registered forester", you are well aware of the issues we have with the general public not knowing who we (Registered Foresters) are and what services and benefits we can provide. No doubt, very few land owners know that it is against the law in the state of Alabama for anyone to give them forest management advice and practice forestry on their land unless that individual is licensed by the "Alabama State Board of Registrations for Foresters". As noted in my last article, the board plans to do some public outreach by putting articles in local county news papers designed to educate the general public. These articles will not only point out the benefits of using registered foresters, but also help them locate the licensed registered foresters in their local areas. The article below will be displayed in newspapers of Counties with strong forestry related ties.

Registered Foresters Can Help Maximize Your Timber "Benefits"

The Alabama State Board of Registration for Foresters highly recommends that you use licensed registered foresters to assist you in all facets of your timber management. Whether you are harvesting, regenerating or planning other forest management activities such as, (burning, release, fertilization etc), registered foresters are best qualified to guide you through the process.

The Alabama State Board of Registration for Foresters (ASBRF) is a professional licensing and regulatory entity authorized by law, September 13, 1957. The mission of the Board as decreed by law is to administer a licensing and regu-

latory program for the practice of forestry in order to benefit and protect the public. Indeed it is against the law for individuals who are not licensed by the (ASBRF) to practice forestry in the state of Alabama. Practicing Forestry includes the offering of professional services such as evaluation, investigation, planning or supervising forestry activities in connection with public or private lands wherein the public's welfare is concerned.

The ASBRF licenses only those foresters who meet the state's educational, experience and other guidelines (BS degree in forestry or closely related field, two year's experience, pass registration exam, maintain continuing education requirements, renews license annually, etc.). In addition, the ASBRF regulate licensed foresters by the imposition and collection of fines and or revoking the license of those who are found guilty of incompetence, misconduct, gross negligence etc. This assures you (the general public) that by using a licensed professional registered forester to assist in managing your timber, you greatly improve your odds of maximizing your timber benefits.

r. Walter E. Cartwright received a Bachelor of Science Degree from Auburn University in 1974 and has served the past 11 years with the Alabama Forestry Commission as Director of the Forest Management Division (September 2014 to present), Director of the Administrative Division, Assistant Director of the Forest Operations Division, Forest Management Division Director, and Assistant Forest Management Division Director. Work with the Commission includes management

ing all programs administered by the Forest Management Division, including Forest Stewardship, Forest Legacy, Forest Inventory and Analysis, Landowner Assistance (Cost Share), Geographic Information Systems, State Lands Management, and Best Management Practices for Forestry. Recent grants include the Longleaf Pine Corridor Restoration Grant involving Longleaf Academies, Silvopasture Research and Longleaf Seed Orchard rehabilitation; Coastal Preharvest

Planning Guide, Best Management Practices Monitoring, and Longleaf Restoration on State Lands through a grant from The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Longleaf Legacy Program. Walter also represents the State of Alabama on the Southern Group of State Foresters Forest Management Chiefs Committee. Walter has published several articles for the Treasure Forest magazine including "Practice What you Preach", "Alabama's Reforestation of Abandoned Mine Lands", "Market Trends", "Timber Stumpage Values vs. Mill Delivered Prices", "Carbon Sequestration", "Partnerships for Conserving Open Spaces", "Developing New Markets: Carbon Trading, Biomass, Ecosystem Services", "Wood Pellets New Source of Energy in Alabama", and "Foresters Practicing Law Without a License?" and has also published Alabama Forestry Commission "Forest Resource Report" from 2004-2008.

He came to the Alabama Forestry Commission from another State agency where he served as the Division Director (State Programs Administrator), Mining and Reclamation Division, within the Alabama Department of Industrial Relations (now AL Dept. of Labor) from July 2003 to March 2004. In his 15 years with that agency he also served as the State Programs Deputy Administrator, Mining and Reclamation Division; Mine Inspection Supervisor/AML Chief Planner; Walter authored and successfully passed amendments to the Alabama Surface Mining Act of 1969. He also served on four different Governor's Task Forces, Initiatives and the Mobile Bay Aquatic Ecosystem Recovery Plan Coalition. He was also

co-author for the USGS Study and Map "Arsenic in Stream Sediments in Alabama". Walter was the chairman of the Reporting and Statistics Committee of the Hurricane Ivan Forest Recovery Task Force in 2004-2005, Hurricane Katrina Forest Recovery Task Force in 2005-2006, and April 2011 Tornado Forest Recovery Task Force. Walter also served as Secretary, Vice Chairman and Chairman of the Montgomery Chapter of the Society of American

Foresters (SAF), Chairman of the Alabama Division of SAF. He is currently serving on the SAF Committee for Professional Recognition and is a former member of the Longleaf Chapter of the Society of American Foresters in Alabama.

Prior to State Service, Walter also worked with several Forest Industries as: General Manager, Three Rivers, Inc., Columbus, MS; Regional Manager, Timberland Harvesters, Eufaula, AL; with MacMillan Bloedel, Inc., Pine Hill, AL for 10 years (Oct. 1977 to Apr.1987) in four positions, including Field Auditor, Mensuration and Development; Truckwood Procurement Representative; Area Forester; and Area Resource Forester. His first Forest Industry employment was as Woodlands Supervisor of Dunbar & Dixon (D&D) Lumber Co., Inc., Brantley, Alabama.

Walter and wife Annette reside in Greenville, Alabama where they are active members of the First United Methodist Church and manage their Stewardship Forest known as The Ponderosa II.

2016 License Renewals

ll registered forester licenses are due to expire on September 30, 2015, unless renewed by that time. Renewal notices for the 2015 renewal period will be mailed by the Board's office on or before July 1. 2014. The current renewal fee is \$100.00 for all licensees. Those who renew their licenses between October 1 and December 31 must pay \$200.00 (renewal fee + \$100.00 late fee). The online renewal application and printable form will be made available at http://asbrf.alabama.gov/ renewalform.htm beginning July 1. If you do not have access to the Internet, please call the Board's office at (334) 240-9301 to request a copy of the renewal form. (Please do not attempt to renew any license prior to July 1.) Important: Those whose licenses have expired for nonrenewal are prohibited from identifying themselves as registered foresters and practicing professional forestry. The Board will revoke the license of any licensee who fails to renew annually by December 31.
